This is the first stage of the exam. The preliminary exam will have a single-question paper and shall be objective in nature. The paper will have a total of 100 MCQs for 100 marks, which means each question carries one mark.

Also, there is a negative in the preliminary exam. For each wrong answer, 0.25 marks will be deducted.

The prelims exam will be conducted only in the English language. The time duration of the exam is 2 hours (120 minutes).

Maharashtra Judiciary Mains Exam Pattern

Those who qualify in the prelims exam are eligible to appear for the mains examination and practice.

In the main exam, there are two papers: Paper 1 and Paper 2. Both papers are descriptive in nature.

The exam will be conducted in both English and Marathi languages. Therefore, it is a good opportunity for those who want to give the Maharashtra Judiciary Exam in the Marathi language.

As per the Maharashtra Judiciary Syllabus Both papers are conducted for 100 marks each. The time duration of the paper is 3 hours.

Paper 1, you will be tested on the following topics:

- Civil Procedure Code
- Transfer of Property Act
- Specific Relief Act
- Law of Contract
- Sale of Goods Act
- Partnership Act

Paper 2, includes the following topics:

- Indian Penal Code
- Evidence Act
- Code of Criminal Procedure
- Essay on Current Legal Topics

The interview is the last stage of the selection process. It is conducted for a total of 50 marks.

In an interview, you will be tested on your character, personality, and suitability for the job. Also, you will be tested on general knowledge, including the acquaintance of current affairs and current issues.
